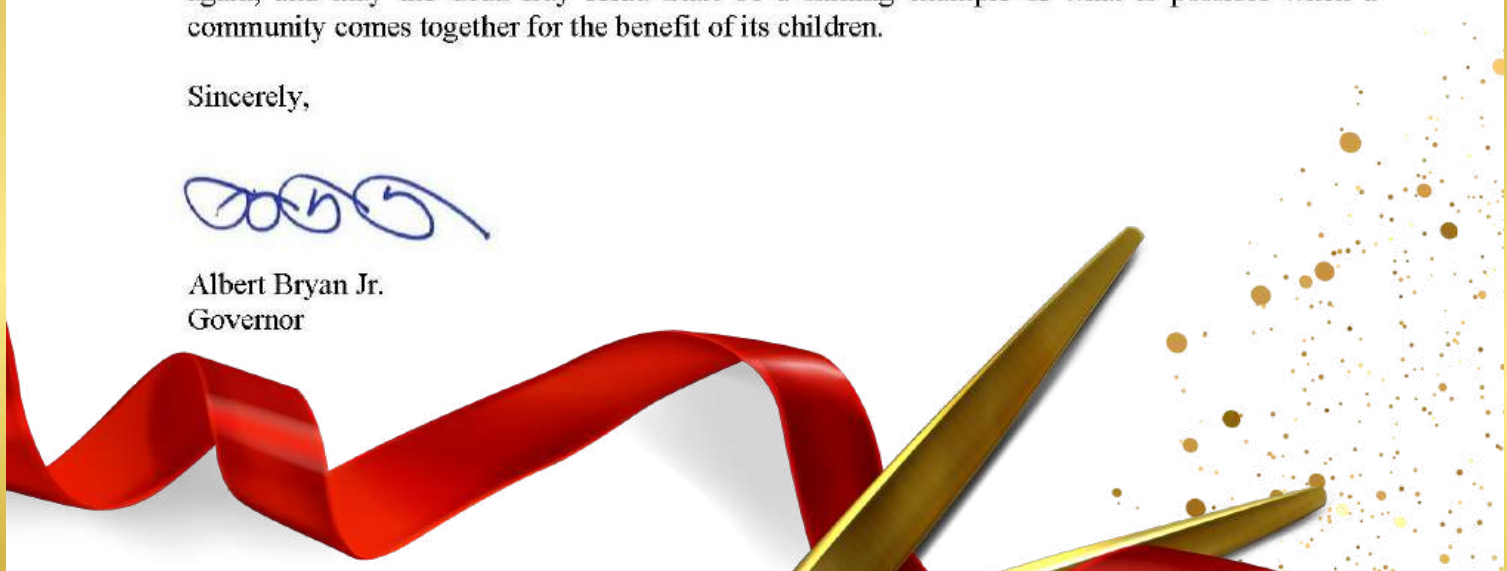

Head Start serves children who are three years old by December 31st and up to five (5) years old at enrollment.

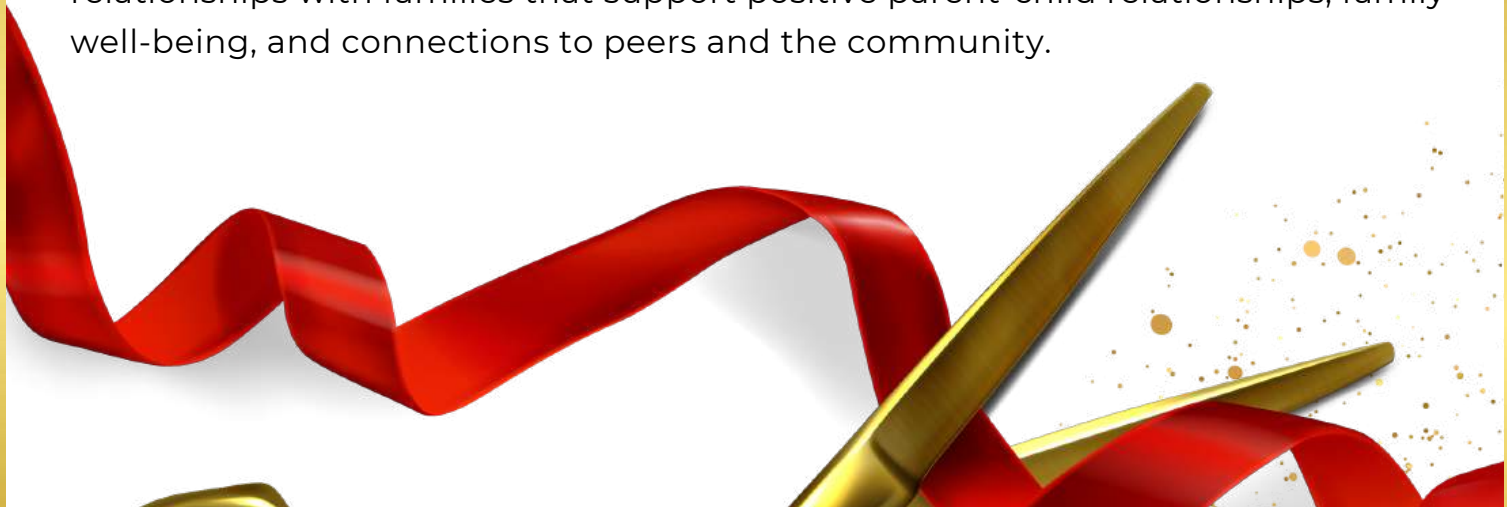
The program promotes the school readiness of young children from low-income families and supports the mental, social, and emotional development of preschoolers.
